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

04. Bc4 Be7	10. g6 d5	16. Rxf8+ Qxf8	0-1
05. d3 Nbd7	11. gxh7+ Kh8	17. Na4? Nf2+	Patterns FTW!
06. 0-0-0-0	12. Bxd5 Bc5+	18. Kg1 Nxd1
