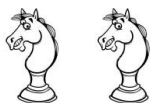

How did Black force a checkmate? Hint: Think double promotion 😊

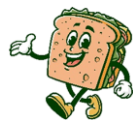


How does White checkmate in 1 move? Hint: There is a trick to this position 😊
